The world has become a troubling place, especially over the last few weeks. Between the attack on Ukraine by Russia and the attacks on innocent people in our own country by crazed young men it is difficult o figure out what is going on. There are loads of theories and all sorts of folks laying all sorts of blame in all sorts of directions. We are living in complicated times – though I don't really think they are any more complicated than previous times. We just have a lot more information being thrown at us and a lot more opinions getting media attention.

It breaks my heart to hear of innocent people – children or adults – being gunned down for no particular reason. It breaks my heart to hear about peoples' lives being destroyed by bombs and missiles for what seems like a difficult to justify reason.

The Facebook chatter wants to put the blame all in one basket – lack of gun control, or lack of mental health care, or violent video games, or lack of parental guidance, etc. Each writer claiming that if we just addressed that problem then all of this would be cleared up. I don't think it is that easy. I think that each of those "causes" contributes, but I think there are larger problems which lay the foundation for the chaos in our society. And all of us – every single one of us – contribute.


take the speck out of your neighbor's eve. Luke 6:41-42

#### PENTECOST OFFERING

Beulah PC will be collecting contributions for the Pentecost Offering on Sunday, June 5. Monterey PC will collect the Pentecost Offering for the entire month of June.

40% of the Pentecost offering collected at the church level is to be kept at the local church level. This is to help churches support their local child and youth ministry (assist families of children at risk, support education for atrisk youth, growing mission work with youth and young adults, ministering to at-risk children and teens, and providing for health and safety).

Congregations then send the remaining 60% of the funds collected to the presbytery. The contributions collected from all the Shenandoah Presbytery

churches are then sent to the denomination. The PCUSA uses your generous offering to support the Young Adult Volunteer (25%), Youth Ministries (25%) and Child Advo June 5, 2022
