Pastor's Letter for July

¹When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. ²Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying:

- ⁴ 'Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.
- ⁵ 'Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.
- ⁶ 'Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.
- ⁷ 'Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy.
- ⁸ 'Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.
- ⁹ 'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.
- ¹⁰ 'Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- ¹¹ 'Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. ¹²Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.



I spent most of last week at the Massanetta Springs Middle School Conference. 250 Middle School youth along with about 25 Senior High "Advocates" and numerous adult leaders and chaperones all living together, studying God's Word, practicing God's Word. It was a truly energizing experience!

I have not been to such a youth event in many years. I used to attend Montreat Youth Conferences, Trienniums and Presbytery youth events on a regular basis. I was involved with several of the earliest Middle School Conferences at Massanetta many years ago. I found that attending such events connected me to other Presbyterians from a wide variety of backgrounds. There were urban folks, suburban folks, and rural folks. There were people of color, people who spoke with different accents, and, of course, people of all ages. The music reflected the diversity, the conversations, reflected the diversity, the teaching reflected the diversity. It was a great way to be reminded that the

children of God are each unique but also share a lot of commonalities.

The words that Jesus spoke were radical back then and they are radical today. The feeling of those in power were that the powerful are blessed. The rich are blessed. The well-fed are blessed. The popular are blessed. Jesus turned that upside down. The folks all the way at the other end of the spectrum are the ones truly blessed. And blessing is not about having stuff, it is about being in right relationship with God. Most of the time the "stuff" we have gets in the way of a right relationship. Not because it has to, but because we allow it.



The Church is the body of Christ. Because Christ was regularly pointing out how upside down the world is the church needs to be doing that also. That is not an easy role. It is not a popular role. But somebody needs to provide a moral compass in a world that seems to have run amok. The best compass I have found is Jesus Christ. In the month of July we will be taking a look at how that might work. Hopefully that will inspire you to join in the challenge. It will not be easy. One of my favorite verses in the Bible is from Jeremiah 12:5



If you have raced with foot-runners and they have wearied you, how will you compete with horses?

Jeremiah was complaining to God about how difficult his job as God's prophet was. God didn't seem to have much sympathy. Instead God said that things were going to get even harder.

We need to keep at it, no matter how difficult it gets. Our most powerful tool is hope. God is still at work in the world. Working through you and working through me. Stay with it!
